Within the Youth in Action Programme, a training course is a project where youth workers and youth leaders come together for several days to develop their knowledge, skills, and attitudes on a certain theme. The daily programme of the course is based on learning objectives and facilitated by experienced trainers. The training courses promote the initiative and creativity of participants and have a direct impact on their future youth work or youth policy activities, such as organising quality projects and providing intercultural and non-formal learning experiences for young people.

Altogether, **22** people from **Austria, Croatia, Cyprus, France, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, and Spain** took part in the project.

The overall aim and specific objectives of the project:

Get Connected aims to support youth workers/youth leaders to enable young people in developing skills and ethical attitudes while using online-media tools. The specific objectives are to share good practices of e-participation, to evaluate opportunities and challenges of youth e-participation, to reflect on skills and attitudes to increase quality in youth e-participation, to explore online tools and resources and to support multiplying effects and networking amongst participants

Main contents and activities of the project:

This training course uses non-formal methods, such as workshops, group work, games, and debates. The aim is to create a space where participants have the time to reflect, share and gain new skills on how they can implement quality project using online tools. The program is based on the participants' experiences, motivations, needs and learning objectives.

Communication in mother tongue

Digital competence

I learned to use my first tablet pc.
I practiced on a large scale the use of PowerPoint, and Adobe Premiere.
I developed new skills in using, sharing and creating information on FaceBook and on a blog.
I developed my abilities to search consistent information on the Internet.
I learned some good practices regarding sharing information on various social media platforms.

Learning to learn

I understood better the importance of various tools used in the process of learning and developing.
I practiced and enhanced the abilities of taking notes and systematize them at the end of the day or session.

Social and civic competences

I got to know and interact with people from different cultures, European, African and Turk.
I gathered cultural, political and social information about Cyprus, Cameroon and Turkey.
I improved my communication skills.
I'm much more concerned of the dangers of sharing personal information on the Internet.
I learned about Maslo's Pyramid.
I made my first public survey.
I gave an interview in front of a video camera.

Sense of initiative and entrepreneurship

During the training I had the opportunity to implement ideas in creative tasks and I learned about tools that can help this process.
I identified potential partners for future projects and programs.
I learned about the Calypso Initiative of the European Commission regarding Accessible Tourism.

Cultural awareness and expression

My knowledge about African cultures, especially of Cameroon, has been extended.
